II. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF JULY 12, 2012

A. Staff Activities Report for July, 2012

The staff activities report was discussed.

B. Medicare Part D Employer Group Waiver Plan (EGWP) Feasibility Study

At the July 12 Committee meeting, Aon Hewitt discussed the Medicare Part D Employer Group Waiver Plan (EGWP) strategy as an alternative to the Retiree Drug Subsidy (RDS). Federal health care reform introduced key changes to Medicare Part D including a 50% pharma discount on brand drugs dispensed in the Part D "donut hole" (2011), and the closing of the Medicare Part D "donut hole" (2011 through 2020). While these changes do not directly affect the ability of LACERA's plans to pass the RDS actuarial equivalence test going forward, they do bring potential savings opportunities through the use of a group-based Medicare Part D plan strategy, leveraging the federal EGWP process. The EGWP approach should transition the Caremark and Express Scripts (PBMs) prescription drug programs from their current position as a sub-contracted part of the Anthem Blue Cross plans to stand-alone Medicare Part D plans for Medicare This change would ultimately replace the RDS strategy, eligible members. minimally impacting retirees (if at all), and is expected to generate better financial results for LACERA.

Aon Hewitt's feasibility study will help LACERA identify the full implications of moving to an EGWP strategy for the future, be well-positioned for strategy implementation, and prepared for ongoing discussions and implementation activities with the PBMs. This study is included under LACERA's contract with Aon and is anticipated to begin on August 15, 2012, with completion by October 15, 2012.
