The meeting was called to order by Chairman Chery at 11:20 a.m.

### II. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF MAY 17, 2012

A motion was made by Mr. Kehoe, seconded by Mr. de la Garza, to approve the minutes of the special meeting of May 17, 2012. The motion passed with Mr. Morris abstaining.

### A. Overpayment & Forgery Receivables (Period Ending March 31, 2012) Robert Hill/ Gloria Harriel/Susana Seeckts/ Stephen Gibbs

Susana Seeckts, Gloria Harriel, and Stephen Gibbs presented the status report on overpayment and forgery receivables for the six month period ending March 31, 2012. There are currently 438 overpayment and forgery cases. Overall, during the past six months we have decreased our overpayments by 3% to \$2.2 million, due to the joint efforts of Claims Processing, Financial and Accounting Services, Quality Assurance, and Systems.

Overpayments are broken out into three categories:

### Death related as a result of late death notification

The majority of the cases are as a result of late death notification. This occurs when we are notified one or more months after the member is deceased. We are using both Pension Benefit Information (PBI) and Berwyn Group to assist with early death notification. We are also on line with the County Registrar/Recorder, and, in that case, are usually notified within a month of the death. Deaths occurring outside of California usually take longer to be reported.

We now partner with Retiree Health Care to assist them in recovering overpayments due to Part B reimbursements for Medicare, which are paid to the member one month in advance. Even though the number of cases is high, the total dollar amount is low in this area.

#### Incorrect computation

This is the third quarter in a row we have had a decrease in this category. This is directly related to additional staff training in areas identified by our supervisors and Quality Assurance.

### Miscellaneous

These are situations over which staff has no control, such as data system clean-up. There was a decrease in this category of about 15%.

Robert Hill discussed the following plans for future collection efforts.

- Clarification of the three-year statute of limitations by LACERA's Legal Office
- Review of internal write-off policies
  - Amounts exceeding staff authority will be presented to the OOC, including cases exceeding the three-year statute of limitations
  - Consider increasing write-off limits for staff authority
  - Consider forwarding cases to the Treasurer Tax Collector earlier in the process, and excluding cases exceeding the three-year statute of limitations
- Set-up processes so underpayments (under collected contributions) are treated similar to overpayments

### B. <u>New Digital Microfiche View Application</u> James Pu

Converting LACERA's microfiche to a digital format was a significant achievement. This preserves the available data and mitigates the risks of deterioration and loss. The digital images are now stored in our Enterprise Content Management system and are backed up to tape for secure storage.

The next step was to design a digital viewer to both emulate the efficiency of the traditional microfiche reader while leveraging the power of database integration. To accomplish this, the entirely in-house designed and developed Microfiche Viewer Application was created. This application introduces never-before-seen capabilities, which include rapid fiche search and retrieval, as well as interoperation to our existing member database system.

Mr. Pu presented a video showing the old microfiche viewing procedures, followed by a live demonstration of the new Microfiche Viewer Application conducted by Eddie Paz.
