Susana Seeckts, Angel Calvo, and David Bayha presented the status report on overpayment and forgery receivables for the six month period ending March 31, 2014. There are currently 460 overpayment and forgery cases. During the past six months the total amount of overpayments has increased 24% to \$960,000.
