SUBJECT: EMAIL INCIDENT REPORT

On March 16, 2016 an employee in Disability Retirement Services, who participates in the LACERA Telecommute program, inadvertently emailed two disability evaluation reports to an unintended recipient. The disability evaluation reports included confidential Personal Health Information (PHI). Upon discovering the error, the employee immediately self reported the incident to her supervisor. Staff contacted the recipient, a current County employee who formerly worked in the LA County Return to Work Unit of the Probation Department, and confirmed the email was not shared and subsequently deleted. The Board was informed of the incident, and notification letters were sent to the impacted members.

Protecting our members' private information is a fundamental value at LACERA that starts with an organizational commitment to safeguard private information, coupled with individual employee responsibilities to vigilantly protect private information. Safeguarding private information is a continuous process of improvement and an essential and integral part of "Protecting the Promised Benefits."
