The International Association of Financial Crimes Investigators (IAFCI) is hosting the 2020 Cyber Fraud Summit on April 15-16, 2020 at the Commons Conference Center in Austin, Texas. The Summit provides training and information on financial fraud, cyber fraud on both domestic and an international level.

The main conference highlights include the following:

- Data Breaches
- Protecting Biometrics Identity
- Payment Fraud
- Ransomware Attacks

The conference meets LACERA's policy on an average of five (5) hours of substantive educational content per day. The approximate cost of the trip is as follows:

Mr. Ian S. Good applied for a service-connected disability retirement on August 3, 2017. On August 1, 2018, the Board granted his application for service-connected disability retirement. However, he appealed the decision because he wanted a Salary Supplement.

Mr. Good filed a timely appeal. On January 3, 2020, he signed a voluntary withdrawal letter advising LACERA that he did not wish to proceed with his appeal.

IT IS THEREFORE RECOMMENDED THAT THE BOARD:

Dismiss with prejudice Ian S. Good's appeal for a service-connected disability retirement with a Salary Supplement.

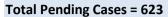

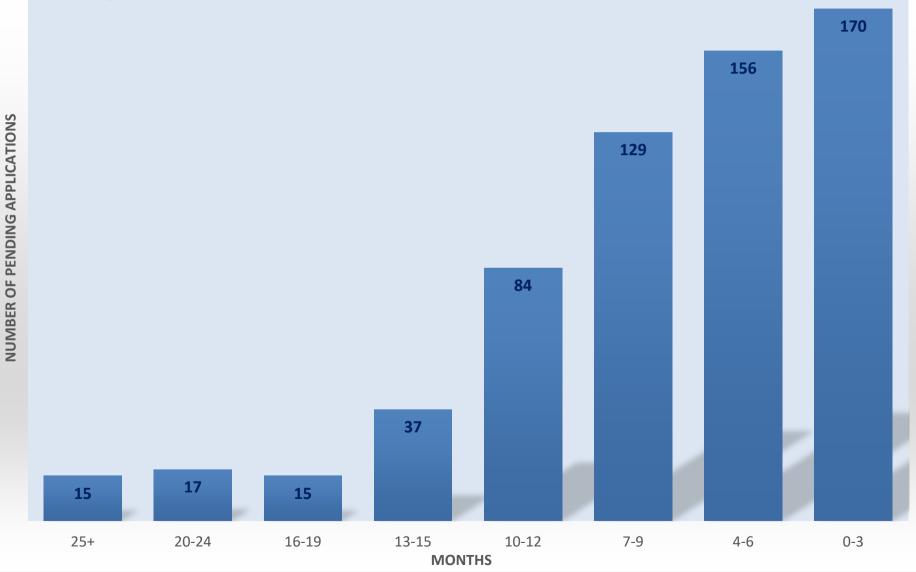
